## **MONROE**

In response to our community need for daycare, our community partners have graciously offered the following options:

[Monroe Boys and Girls Club](#): Normal childcare rates will be discounted by 50% to lessen the impact on our families during school closures. Space is available at most clubs for new members, please contact your local club for more information and availability. As a thank you to our healthcare professionals and first responders, their children will be given free childcare during this time.

[Monroe/Sky Valley YMCA](#): The YMCA is also offering daycare for healthcare and first responder families at no cost, with a \$45.00 daily rate for drop-in children, and financial aid for families in need. They are asking families to please try to sign up this weekend or Monday.

## **MT. VERNON**

The primary focus of school closures is safety and wellness for our community at large. A key component of reaching that goal is to reduce the impact of school closures on our community's ability to have essential staff present at hospitals, health care facilities, and at police and fire departments. We will also be offering this service to essential MVSD staff who are reporting to work.

- MVSD Childcare is for children of health care workers and first responders.
- It is for the school age children who are currently enrolled in MV Schools.
- It will be offered at each of our six elementary schools.

- Children would go to the child care site at the elementary school they currently attend as that is where we have all of their student/emergency records.
- We would make arrangements for students older than elementary age, in terms of which site they attended.
- Two meals would be available each day.
- Hours would be 8:00 am to 4:00 pm.

## **NORTHSHORE**

Our district has created space in five schools for our community partners to provide childcare. ## **SEATTLE**

Seattle Public Schools is working with our existing child care providers — City of Seattle, Public Health Seattle and King County, and the State Department of Children, Youth, and Families — to develop potential approaches for families with the most critical need, including first responders to COVID-19. We continue to receive updated guidance from the Department of Children, Youth, and Families on how school-based providers might offer child care as safely as possible in our buildings while ensuring recommended social distancing.

SPS does not have funding to pay for child care. We are working with philanthropic and other municipal partners to find solutions to support operational and staffing costs. We will continue to keep families informed if child care options become available.
